TITLE: Watershed Visitor Center Intern

SUMMARY: The Nature Museum is located in Southern Vermont and opens the door to New England's natural world for all ages to explore and learn. Using a combination of our museum exhibits, hands-on materials, and outdoor spaces, we strive to bring rich experiences to our visitors.

One of the museum's commitments is the promotion and exploration of the Connecticut River Watershed. As we begin to develop a closer tie with the river, the Museum has partnered with TransCanada Corporation's hydroelectric facility in Bellows Falls, VT, to create onsite education for the Fish Ladder at the Watershed Visitors Center. This internship is designed for someone who wants to manage the educational facets of a visitor center through exhibitry and programming. The intern is charged with engaging and enhancing a visitor's experience at the Fish Ladder by creating exhibits and interactive displays and activities. In addition to exhibit design, the internship will include organizing and promoting public programs both in the field and at the center.
